April 1, 2013

70% of sexual assaults are not reported. For Native Americans, who for generations internalized both social and personal oppression, reporting an assault can be extremely difficult.

April 3, 2013

Use your voice to proclaim it's time for change! Sign a Sexual Assault proclamation!

April 4, 2013

It's time ... to talk about it! Sexual Assault Awareness Month is about healthy childhood sexual development!

April 5, 2013

All adults have a role in child Sexual Abuse prevention. Learn how you can support healthy childhood sexual development by contacting (insert local tribal agency name).

Sexual Assault Awareness Month is making the connection! Understanding healthy development supports healthy kids!

April 7, 2013

Little documentation detailing the present extent of sexual assault of Indian women exists. Major contributing factors include the low priority society gives this problem, limited funding for research and the lack of reporting by Indian women fearful of the treatment they will receive from the criminal justice system.

Start talking about healthy childhood development to prevent child sexual abuse.

Incorporating cultural and traditional practices, including talking circles, healing ceremonies for those who have been sexually assaulted, gender specific traditional gatherings for victims and survivors, along with sweat lodges will aid in the healing of your tribal communities.
